PROFILE: COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH CENTERS

1. SUMMARY

Collaborative Research Centers are long-term research institutions at universities. They promote scientific cooperation within the framework of interdisciplinary research programs. Collaborative Research Centres make it possible to work on demanding, complex and long-term research projects by concentrating and coordinating the resources available at universities. Collaborative Research Centers are characterized by cooperation across the boundaries of subjects, institutes, departments and faculties. The DFG offers the possibility of funding such Collaborative Research Centers at one university or as SFB/Transregio at two or three universities.

2. REQUIREMENTS

Universities and equivalent higher education institutions with the right to award doctorates are eligible to apply. At least 60% of the sub-projects must be based at the university itself; the non-university share may not exceed 30%.
