

# PROFILE: EMMY NOETHER PROGRAMME (DFG)

## 1. SUMMARY

The Emmy Noether Program gives outstandingly qualified young scientists the opportunity to qualify for a university professorship by independently leading a junior research group. Funding is provided for a total of 6 years, whereby the application is initially approved for 3 years with the prospect of three further years. On the basis of an interim report, which should be submitted up to 6 months before the end of the third year, a further 3 years can be approved. An application can be submitted at any time.

## 2. REQUIREMENTS

The PhD must have been completed with an outstanding result and applicants must have published demanding papers in high-ranking international journals. Applications are no longer possible if an appointment has already been obtained or is imminent.

## 3. FACTS

<b>Funding goal</b>	Qualification as a university lecturer, (re)attracting young academics from abroad
<b>Target group</b>	Young academics from all disciplines, generally up to 4 years after completing their PhD
<b>Funding period</b>	6 years: 3+3 years
<b>Object of funding</b>	Module-dependent, usually staff costs, job creation, material resources Family allowances and/or various lump sums
<b>Funding amount</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Staff costs, between 54,300 EUR and 114,300 EUR per year</li><li>• Family allowance of up to 6000 EUR per year</li><li>• Lump sum for equal opportunities measures up to 1000 EUR per funding year</li><li>• Further funding</li></ul>
<b>Deadline</b>	Depending on the module
<b>Processing time</b>	Up to 8 months
<b>Funding quota</b>	2022: 17,8% across all subjects
