

PROFILE: PRIORITY PROGRAMMES

1. SUMMARY

The Priority Program is a form of strategic research funding with an open call for proposals. The aim of the program is to work on topics that can be expected to have a formative effect on a scientific field. This impact can be achieved through the discovery of new research areas as well as by rethinking known areas, working on them from a new perspective or using a new approach and creating momentum for this. Interdisciplinary applications can develop particular potential here. The Priority Program funds individual research projects that contribute to achieving the knowledge objectives formulated in the institution's application.

2. REQUIREMENTS

All researchers who are working in Germany or at a German research institution abroad and who have completed their education - usually with a doctorate - can participate in the preparation of a proposal. A generally interdisciplinary program committee (maximum of five persons) is formed from the circle of participants. Female scientists are to be appropriately involved according to their subject area.

Funding goal	Supra-regional cooperation in stimulating projects with further development of science
Target group	Scientists with a PhD
Funding period	Max. 6 years (3+3)
Object of funding	Establishment of a priority program or project within the framework of an existing program, project-specific, material and staff resources, investment funds
Funding amount	Not specified
Deadline	October 15 of each year for the establishment of a new priority program, for participation in an existing program to be taken from the call for applications
Processing time	Senate decides annually on the establishment of new priority programs
Funding quota	Not specified
